

**Driving Directions to
South San Francisco Convention Center**

FROM SAN JOSE: Take Highway 101 North to the South Airport Blvd exit #424 (2 miles north of SFO). At the first stop light, drive straight across the intersection and into the Holiday Inn parking lot. The Conference Center is on the left.

FROM SAN FRANCISCO: Take Highway 101 South to the South Airport Blvd exit #424 in South San Francisco. Stay to the right and turn east under the freeway overpass. Make a right at the Hungry Hunter Restaurant onto South Airport Blvd. The Conference Center is on the left between the CitiGarden Hotel and the Holiday Inn.

FROM MARIN COUNTY, 19TH AVENUE, DALY CITY: Take the Golden Gate Bridge to 19th Ave and continue on to Highway 280 southbound. From Highway 280 take Highway 380 East to Highway 101 North (San Francisco). From Highway 101 North, exit at South Airport Blvd. At the first stop light, drive straight across the intersection and into the Holiday Inn parking lot. The Conference Center is on the left. (Note: there is a South Airport Blvd exit off Highway 380--do not take this exit. Take the exit off of Highway 101 North.)

PARKING: The Conference Center shares complimentary parking with its neighboring hotels, the Holiday Inn to the south and the CitiGarden Hotel to the north. Additional parking is available diagonally across the street in the lot between the Travelodge and the Best Western Grosvenor Hotel.
